Characters for Greece

Achilles: (uh-kil'-eez)Greek hero in the Trojan War; Achilles was the most handsome of the heroes assembled against Troy

Agamemnon: (ag-uh-mem'-nahn) "King of Kings" over all the kings of Greece; had a black beard

Ajax: ruler of Salamis; Ajax was one of the suitors of Helen and so was one of the members of thGreek force against Troy in the Trojan War. He was almost as skilled a fighter as Achilles.

Briseis: (Brī-sē-is) or (Brī-say'-is)a Trojan woman given to Achilles awarded to Achilles during the war

Calchas: (kal'-kuhs) chief among the seers or soothsayers (fortune-tellers) who predicted the future; had a gift for interpreting the flight of birds.

Chryseis: (Krī-'sē-əs) or (Krī-say-is) a Trojan woman & daughter of a priest of Apollo, the sun god; was given to Agamemnon as plunder from the war

Diomedes: (*Dio-mē-dēs*) "God-like cunning" or "advised by Zeus" a hero in the Trojan War; King of Argos; brother of Agamenon; regarded alongside Ajax as one of the best warriors of all the Achaean's; close companion to Odysseus; He enters the war with a fleet of 80 ships, third only to Agamemnon's **Helen**: wife of King Menelaus; the most beautiful of all women

King Menelaus: (men-uh-lay'-uhs) King of Sparta and central figure in war against Troy; his wife Helen deserted him for Paris (from Troy)

Myrmidons: ('mər-mə-,däns) brave and skilled warriors commanded by Achilles

Nestor: (nes'-tur) the "old wise man" and King of Pylos

Odysseus: (oh-dis'-ee-uhs) leader of the Greeks; legendary King of Ithica

Patroclus: (pa-'trah-klus) King of Opus, and was Achilles' beloved comrade

Peleus: ('pē-lē-əs) Father of Achilles

Thetis: (thee-tis) Mother of Achilles

Aeneas: (ih-nee-uhs) or (ih-nay' uhs) a hero of Troy

Andromache: (an-drom -ah-kee) wife of Hector

Hector: the war leader for Troy; first-born son of King Priam

Helenus: Son of King Priam and Queen Hecuba of Troy

Oenone: (ē-'nō-nē) the first wife of Paris, whom he abandoned for Helen

Paris: King Priam's son

Priam: (pri'-am) King of Troy

Queen Hecuba (hek'yoo-buh) Queen to Priam & Paris' mother

Sarpedon: (sahr-peed -n) fought for Troy; Zeus's son by a mortal mother; Lord of Lycia

Aphrodite: (af-roh-dy'tee) Goddess of love, beauty, and desire (was for Troy)

Apollos: (*uh*-**pol**-oh) son god; god of art, music, and healing

Athene: (a-thee'-na) the goddess of wisdom, civilization, warfare, strength, strategy, female arts,

crafts, justice and skill (was for Greece)

Hera: Zeus' wife; the Queen of the Gods

Zeus: (zoos) King of the Gods
